The Honorable Alan D. Lourie was appointed to the U. S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit on April 6, 1990. At the time of his appointment, he was a member of the Board of Directors of Intellectual Property Owners Association (IPO). He was employed by SmithKline Beecham Corp., now part of GlaxoSmithKline, where he was Vice President, Corporate Patents and Trademarks, and Associate General Counsel.

Judge Lourie received a bachelor's degree from Harvard University, a master's degree in chemistry from the University of Wisconsin, and a Ph.D. in chemistry from the University of Pennsylvania. He received his J.D. degree from Temple University.

Before being appointed to the court, he served as Vice Chairman of the Industry Functional Advisory Committee on Intellectual Property Rights, which advises the Department of Commerce and the U.S. Trade Representative, and chaired the patent committee of the Pharmaceutical Manufacturers Association. In 1982 and 1984 he was a member of the U.S. delegation to the Diplomatic Conference on the Revision of the Paris Convention. He is a recipient of the Jefferson Medal of the New Jersey Intellectual Property Law Association, given for extraordinary contributions to the field of intellectual property law.

Judge Lourie is married and has two daughters and four grandchildren.

The Honorable James E. Rogan was sworn in as Under Secretary of Commerce for Intellectual Property and Director of the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) on December 7, 2001. Judge Rogan becomes the 55th head of the agency. He was nominated by President George W. Bush on May 25, 2001, and confirmed unanimously by the United States Senate on November 30, 2001.

Judge Rogan manages USPTO's operations and is policy advisor to the Bush Administration on all domestic and international intellectual property

matters. He also co-chairs the National Intellectual Property Law Enforcement Coordination Council, which oversees domestic and international intellectual property law enforcement issues among federal entities.

Among the Under Secretary's top priorities are securing adequate funding to improve the quality and minimize the processing times of patents and trademarks, as well as strengthening enforcement of patent, trademark, and copyright protections worldwide.

The association advocates effective and affordable IP ownership rights and provides a wide array of services to members. It concentrates on: supporting member interests relating to legislative and international issues; analyzing current IP issues; providing information and educational services; and disseminating information to the general public on the importance of intellectual property rights.

Government Affairs

Promoting the Interests of the Owner

IPO advocates effective protection for patents, trademarks, copyrights, and trade secrets, and also urges laws that provide reasonable certainty to avoid undue litigation. IPO positions are communicated to Congress, the U.S. Copyright Office, the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office, the U.S. Trade Representative and other agencies.

PTO Fee Withholding – Since 2000, a top IPO priority has been to end the government’s practice of withholding patent and trademark fee collections from the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office or diverting collections to unrelated government programs. More than \$600 million has been withheld, depriving IPO members of an equivalent amount of service.

IPO provides several educational and networking opportunities each year that bring together experts from the United States and abroad to discuss trends and recent developments in IP law.

IPO meetings include the IPO Annual Meeting, which is held in a major U.S. city each fall, committee-sponsored CLE programs such as “Managing Corporate IP Today” and “PTO Appellate and Interference Practice in the New Millennium,” and the well-known PTO Day conference which has been held for the last 15 years in cooperation with the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office.

IP is being challenged in connection with controversies over access to AIDS treatments and other medicines, issues of “open source” licensing, piracy through web-based song swapping services, and the desire of developing countries to protect “traditional knowledge.” Moreover, government officials are reexamining the IP-antitrust interface.

IPO works to increase public awareness on the importance of technology and patents to U.S. industry and the national economy by honoring an outstanding American inventor each year with **National Inventor of the Year Award**.
