



## The Nagoya Protocol: Conserving Biodiversity or Withering the Fruits of Innovation?

#### **Utility & Patent Eligibility Standards**

The recent Supreme Court decisions in *Myriad, Prometheus* and *Alice* have given rise to a good deal of speculation on where the lines between patent eligibility and ineligibility are drawn. Recent USPTO guidelines have issued, the Patent Office appears to be rejecting more and more applications on 35 U.S.C. §101 grounds and the Federal Courts are making findings on patent eligibility across technical sectors. This panel will address the level of uncertainty and challenges as seen not only in the court room but also by patent practitioners in the recent past. #### TTAB Update and Implications of *B&B Hardware, Inc. v.* Hargis Industries, Inc. for Corporations

The Trademark Trial and Appeal Board is contemplating general rule changes, along with the implications of the Supreme Court decision in *B&B Hardware, Inc. v. Hargis Industries, Inc.,* which held that a court should give preclusive effect to TTAB decisions if the ordinary elements of issue preclusion are met. These changes and this decision may have a profound impact on trademark litigation and strategy in the US. This session will cover TTAB rule changes, an overview of the B&B decision, the procedural differences between TTAB and federal court proceedings, the circumstances under which issue preclusion may apply, an analysis of how trademark enforcement may be impacted and strategic considerations in determining when to file and how to handle TTAB vs. federal court actions.


