

SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES

STUART BARAN – Stuart Baran is a barrister at leading intellectual property chambers Three New Square in London, UK. He studied Chemistry and then a doctorate in Physical Chemistry (laser spectroscopy) at the University of Oxford before qualifying into law. Stuart has already appeared in many of the leading UK intellectual property cases across the full range of technologies in patents and SPCs, as well as major trade mark disputes. He has appeared in all UK fora up to the UK Supreme Court, where he was the sole junior barrister for Eli Lilly in the recent pemetrexed litigation. He has also appeared before the EPO and the General Court of the EU. He is a ranked practitioner / “leading junior” in several directories, including in Chambers & Partners and in the Legal500.
