

INTERESTS AND ACTIVITY OF THE SOVEREIGN VIS-À-VIS PRIVATE INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS AVAILABLE LIVE AND ON-DEMAND

This panel will explore changes in the foundations and implementation of governmental authority over the granting and utilization of privately held IPRs, and will look at impacts on innovation and technological development in health-related areas. Particular topics include Section 101 and government rights and immunities under Section 1498(a), the Defense Production Act, and the PREP Act. The discussion will also touch on the evolution of the technology transfer in the 40 years since passage of the Bayh-Dole and Stevenson-Wydler Acts, and a peek into their continuing influence into the future.

ELECTRONIC AND DIGITAL SIGNATURES: OBTAINING SIGNATURES WITH ATTORNEYS AND INVENTORS WORKING FROM HOME AVAILABLE LIVE AND ON-DEMAND

The current "work from home" situation has made getting "wet" signatures from inventors and attorneys a challenge for both corporations and law firms. This session will address the advantages and disadvantages of electronic signatures worldwide, for both patent office forms and formal documents (e.g., assignments and declarations). IP POLICY CONSIDERATIONS AND STRATEGIES FOR PROTECTING AI AVAILABLE ON-DEMAND

Artificial intelligence (AI) continues to present new challenges and opportunities in IP. The panel will focus on timely topics surrounding AI, including different types of IP protection available, inventorship/authorship issues, and strategies for patenting AI in the U.S. and Europe.

EVOLVING MONETARY REMEDIES IN TRADE SECRETS DISPUTES AVAILABLE ON-DEMAND

At the same time that trade secret litigation is on the rise, there has been a shift from focusing on injunctions as the principal remedy towards seeking monetary awards. But while monetary awards in trade secret cases are increasing in number and in amount, reversals and remands of trade secrets awards persist as the law governing monetary trade secret remedies continues to evolve. This session will focus on the challenges associated with proving damages resulting from trade secret misappropriation and developing a shared vocabulary and useful approaches for valuing the impact of misappropriation.

IDENTIFYING AND AVOIDING OBSTACLES WHILE PREPARING SUPPLIER AGREEMENTS AVAILABLE ON-DEMAND

In this presentation, the speakers will navigate the complex IP issues that arise during the negotiation, execution, and later litigation of supplier agreements. Each speaker will represent a different viewpoint of the agreement (i.e., buyer, seller, litigator) as the panel discusses several key aspects of supplier agreements.

MULTI-NATIONAL INVENTORSHIP ISSUES AVAILABLE ON-DEMAND

IP owners with inventors in various countries face a wide variety of inventor compensation issues and potentially conflicting First-to-File/Foreign Filing License issues. This panel will discuss inventor compensation, rewards, and remuneration in a number of jurisdictions.

It will also provide a better understanding of the existing rules and cooperative arrangements that IP owners and intermediaries have developed, including the existing liability regimes and safe harbors for Internet-based intermediaries.

BEST PRACTICES FOR DECLUTTERING THE U.S. TRADEMARK REGISTER AVAILABLE ON-DEMAND

This session will address developments in U.S. trademark law, including the Trademark Modernization Act that seeks to streamline procedures for eliminating registrations for unused marks. The panel will discuss current tools available to brand owners as well as new U.S. Patent and Trademark Office initiatives aimed at ensuring the accuracy and integrity of the register, such as the rule requiring foreign-domiciled applicants and registrants to use a U.S.-licensed attorney, the new digital specimen Exam Guide, increased specimen refusals, increased audits of post-registration maintenance filings, and establishment of an email address via which third parties can report fake specimens of use.
